² **Arabic and French language requirements**: A total of 6 SCH in these languages is a requirement of the GER. Students take 0-6 SCH of ARB and/or 0-6 SCH of FRN, depending on their background (read "a", "b" and "c" below to see which category you belong to).

a- Students holding a Moroccan baccalaureate or having had Arabic as the language of instruction in high school are not required to take any ARB courses. They fulfill the Arabic language requirement by taking one of the following GER content courses taught in Arabic: HIS1302, HUM 2303, HUM 2304, LIT 2304, or LIT 2305 (see note 4). The French language requirement of the GER should be met by taking French courses depending on the TEF score. Any additional credits earned (e.g. to fulfill prerequisite requirements) will not count towards the degree.

b- Students who have not had Arabic as the language of instruction in high school are required to successfully complete 3-6 SCH depending on the placement test that will determine which Arabic courses are needed (ARB 1310, or ARB 1320). A maximum of 6 SCH

in Arabic can be counted as fulfilling the GER language requirement (if exempted from French courses). Any additional credits earned (e.g. to fulfill prerequisite requirements) will not count towards the degree.

- c- Students holding a non-Moroccan diploma with no former instruction in either Arabic or French fulfill the language requirement by taking two courses in either French or Spanich by placement, and no specific exit level. The 6 SCH must be completed in the same language. Any additional credits earned (e.g. to fulfill prerequisite requirements) will not count towards the degree.
- ³ All students are required to satisfy the TEF-B2 level of French, or take the required course(s) to reach the level needed, FRN 3310, before graduation. Students will take a placement test which determines the French courses (such as FRN 2310) needed to achieve this level of proficiency. A maximum of 6 SCH in French can be counted as fulfilling the GER requirement. Any additional courses (such as FRN 1305 and FRN 1308) will not count towards the degree and will be graded on a Pass/Fail basis. All students must also pass the French component of the Exit Exam
- ⁴ History and Humanities I requirements: read "a", "b" and "c" below to see which category you belong to.
- **a-** Students holding a Moroccan baccalaureate or having had Arabic as the language of instruction in high school are required to take one of the following GER content courses: HIS 1302, HUM 2303, HUM 2304, LIT 2304, or LIT 2305 (see note 2). They may not take the equivalent courses in English (i.e. HIS 1301, HUM 2301, HUM 2302, or LIT 2301) to fulfill another requirement.
- **b-** Students holding a non-Moroccan diploma where Arabic is the language of instruction are required to take one content course taught in Arabic (HIS 1302, HUM 2303, HUM 2304, LIT 2304, or LIT 2305) to fulfill a History or Humanities requirement of the GER. They may not take the equivalent courses in English (i.e. HIS 1301, HUM 2301, HUM 2302) to fulfill another requirement. The language requirement is met by taking two courses in either French or Spanich by placement, and no specific exit level. The 6 SCH must be completed in the same language. Any additional credits earned (e.g. to fulfill prerequisite requirements) will not count towards the degree.
- c- Students who have a French/international baccalaureate or have not had Arabic as the language of instruction in high school must not take these courses; they have to take the equivalent courses in English (i.e. HIS 1301, HUM 2301, HUM 2302, or LIT 2301).
- ⁵ Students minoring in Business Administration must take MTH 1305 as part of the GER. If they take MTH 1388 as a prerequisite to MTH 1305, the credits of the former will not count in the degree.
