* Arabic and French language requirements: A total of 6 SCH in these languages is a requirement of the UCC. Students take 0-6 SCH of Arabic and/or 0-6 SCH of French, depending on their background. Students holding a Moroccan baccalaureate or having had Arabic as the language of instruction in high school are not required to take Arabic courses (0 SCH). They fulfill the Arabic language requirement by taking one of the following UCC content courses taught in Arabic: HIS1302, HUM3303, LIT2304, or LIT2305. Language requirement in the UCC should be met by taking French courses depending on the TEF score.

Students who have not had Arabic as the language of instruction in high school are required to successfully complete ARB1320 and any lower level pre-requisite Arabic language courses. A placement test will determine which Arabic courses (such as ARB1309 and ARB1310) are needed. A maximum of 6 SCH in Arabic can be counted as fulfilling the UCC language requirement. Any additional credits will not count towards the degree. All students must also pass the Arabic component of the Exit Exam.

All students are required to satisfy the TEF-B2 level of French, or take the required course(s) to reach the level needed, FRN3310, before graduation. Students will take a placement test which determines the French courses (such as FRN2310) needed to achieve this level of proficiency. A maximum of 6 SCH in French can be counted as fulfilling the UCC requirement. Any additional courses (such as FRN1305 and FRN1308) will not count towards the degree and will be graded on Pass/Fail basis. All students must also pass the French component of the Exit Exam.

** History and Humanities requirement: Students who take a content course taught in Arabic (HIS1302, HUM3303, HUM3304, LIT2304, or LIT2305) fulfill a History or Humanities requirement of the UCC. They may not take the equivalent course in English (HIS2301, HUM3301, HUM3302) or Arabic (ARB2304, ARB2305) to fulfill another requirement.

(1) CS majors students minoring in Business Administration must take MTH 1300 as part of the University Common Core. If they take MTH 1388 as a prerequisite to MTH 1300, the credits of the former will not count in the degree.
